A Typical Day at Camp


7:30am	A hearty breakfast followed by a morning meditation and musical selection to set the day off to a good start.

Details on Where We Will Be Staying



The camping tradition runs deep within the Canadian spirit. This Summer Camp is offered at the Powell Lake Outdoor Learning Centre a brand new state of the art outdoor education Centre near Powell River BC. Situated at the top of the Sunshine Coast of British Columbia, the camp is very near to the city of Powell River, which is located 170 km north of Vancouver BC.

Nestled in the stunning beauty of Powell River's secluded backcountry in the heart of the Coast Mountain Range the camp is surrounded by parkland and forest. Established on a small headland between two bays on the shores of Powell Lake the area was once a salt-water fjord more than one-mile deep in places.

Owned and operated by the Powell River Board of Education (SD#47), the Powell Lake Outdoor Learning Centre (OLC) houses up to sixty people in six beautiful handcrafted cabins built from locally sourced timbers. In addition to full group sized bathrooms in each of the cabins the lodge is also well equipped with accessible washrooms, showers and administrative spaces. Built for people of all abilities the site is fully wheelchair accessible.

The 5 ha site is bright and sunny and its range of activity options provides participants and groups with a range of ways to challenge themselves outdoors. The facility boasts immediate access to the 180 km Sunshine Coast Trail as well as the Powell Forest Canoe Route, a circuit of roughly a dozen lakes and portages. A short hike from the Centre will bring you to BC's first

and only fully accessible wilderness park area, featuring a 13km long barrier free lakeside trail with cabins and other amenities.

General Terms

I (we) agree:

- 1. The terms of this contract apply for the summer program held in July and August in which the camper is enrolled at the Powell Lake Outdoor Learning Centre (the "Centre"). Specific dates for the program are contained on the Summer Camp Registration Form.
- 2. A camper will not be accepted into the Camp unless all the enrolment forms have been completed in full and signed. Full payment, Health Number and/or proof of health insurance, must accompany the enrolment form. Campers must provide a copy of their birth certificate, proof of citizenship status and immunization documentation. A student is considered accepted into the Camp only upon a confirmation form being issued by the Centre.
- 3. Parents and Guardians hereby acknowledge that the Centre is not free of allergens. I/We understand that my child may inadvertently come into contact with a substance he/she may be allergic to and that such contact may cause an allergic reaction. I understand that there are certain risks of allergen contact that are inherent in a camp setting.
- 4. Summer program fees are due upon registration at the rates published per participant. Summer program fees are non transferable and non refundable. Once paid, there will be no refund of summer program fees after May 1, 2019 whatsoever, including but not. All summer Camps offered are subject to change and/or cancellation at any time and are offered subject to sufficient enrolment, as determined by the Centre. Should the Centre decide to cancel a program due to low enrolment, all fees paid to date shall be fully refunded without interest or penalty.

- 5. There are no refunds for withdrawals, and no refunds for holidays, sick days, or days missed for any reason, throughout the summer program.
- 6. The Group or campers full name must be written on the back of each and every cheque.
- 7. A charge of \$50.00 will be levied against all N.S.F. cheques or cheques returned for any reason.
- 8. Fees for the summer Camp are due upon registration. Campers will not be allowed to attend unless payment has been made.
- 9. The Centre reserves the right to expel a camper immediately and take whatever action it deems necessary to collect such overdue accounts.
- 10. The Camp Organizer reserves the right to accept or reject this application and also to expel a camper at any time.
- 11. Campers face expulsion from the Centre for using, possessing or trafficking drugs, alcohol or other controlled substances on the Centres premises, during excursions, when returning to the Centre or when travelling from Centre to home. Campers found trafficking any controlled substance may also face criminal prosecution.
- 12. The Centre reserves the right to make such rules and regulations in the operation of the Centre as it deems appropriate and it is a condition of acceptance that these rules and regulations be observed.
- 13. The Centre reserves the right to change fees at anytime. Withdrawal Procedure: The Centre requires written notice of a camper's withdrawal; however, there will be no refund or transfer of the summer program fees.
- 14. Campers who are expelled from Camp cannot re register with the summer programs. I have read and understood the terms of contract, the methods of payment, and the policies of the Camp as outlined t and I hereby agree to all the terms and conditions stated therein.
- 15. The Parent / Guardian shall indemnify and save harmless the Centre or its contractors from and against all claims and demands, losses, costs, expenses, damages and injury in any manner based upon, arising out of or connected with the existence of this Agreement or anything done or maintained hereunder, unless such damage or injury is due to the negligence of any officer or servant of the Renter.
